10 am-4 pm: RECONCILIATION: Fr. Knab will hear confessions each hour on the hour in church.



A Pilgrim's Progress

As our ROSARY RENEWAL MISSION begins at 7:00 P.M. tonight at Immaculate Conception, again I invite all to participate as fully as possible. Each day Fr. George will focus on a different set of mysteries drawing new hope from scripture, prayer, and devotion. I believe actively engaging in our mission will help us, as last Wednesday's Gospel from St. Luke challenged, "to set our hand to the plow and not look back."

Recently someone in the news was quoted as saying "my idea of self, of family, of community, of the wider world comes from my religion. It's not so much the Bible, the Beatitudes, the 10 Commandments, the Sacraments, or the prayers. It's the culture" Which begs the obvious question Declan Leary asked in an article this week what kind of Catholic culture exists apart from these things? These are the tools that God has given us to transform ourselves and our world. I pray that our mission will help us to do both of these things.

Similarly, this week while visiting after mass one of our faithful parishioners wondered out loud to me if in a post-virus world our people would return to mass. She was skeptical. While the Eucharist has been the center of her life for longer than most of us have been alive, she knew that was not the case for many. So many are living their lives as "practical atheists." That is, as if God does not exist. Or that God's existence does not impact the choices they make each day. How else are we to understand that the public positions of so many of our Catholic public officials are indistinguishable from those with no explicit faith and consistently conflict with Church teaching. How closely does their public record mirror the lives of we the people they are supposed to be representing?

There can be no conflict between being a faithful Catholic and a good citizen. Our country's greatness will always be dependent on her goodness. And for Catholic Christians goodness is defined by the teaching of Jesus Christ. In the last century every military chaplain awarded the Medal of Honor was a Catholic priest. St. James wrote that "faith without works in dead." May our Catholic faith always be the defining principle of our life and works. May our ROSARY RENEWAL MISSION help bring us closer to that goal and may it helps us to be a good witness to others as well.


