Matthew 26:14-27:66

Prepare For Next Sunday’s Readings

Next Sunday we celebrate Easter. Our Gospel tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. The details invite us to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection. The only woman attending the tomb is Mary of Magdala. Mary is simply said to have observed that the stone that had sealed the tomb had been moved, and she runs to alert Simon Peter and the beloved disciple. Her statement to them is telling. She assumes that Jesus' body has been removed, perhaps stolen. She does not consider that Jesus has been raised from the dead. Simon Peter and the beloved disciple race to the tomb, presumably to verify Mary's report. The beloved disciple arrives first but does not enter the tomb until after Simon Peter. The presence of the burial cloths in the tomb offers evidence to the listener that Jesus' body had not been stolen. The Gospel passage concludes, however, that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples do not yet understand about the Resurrection. In the weeks ahead, the Gospel readings from our liturgy will show us how the disciples came to believe in Jesus' Resurrection through his appearances to them. Our Easter faith is based on their witness to both the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus—in his appearances and in his gift of the Holy Spirit.

LENTEN REGULATIONS – 1. ABSTINENCE

– Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. 2. **FAST – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person’s needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal.

Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed. 3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

A Pilgrim's Progress

Our faithful Lenten journeys have brought us to this holiest of weeks in the Church year.

On Tuesday at our Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception Bishop Paprocki will consecrate the holy oils (sacred chrism, oil of the infirm, and the oil of catechumens) to be used in the celebration of the Sacraments in each parish throughout the coming year. We priests will renew our promises to the bishop: to be more united with and closely conformed to Christ as we pledged on our ordination day and to be faithful stewards of the mysteries of God and the office of teaching,

The Triduum (Latin for three days) is the three days we mark the Paschal Mystery, the passion, crucifixion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We begin with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and conclude with the Easter Vigil on Saturday night. It is to be seen as one liturgy celebrated over three days rather than three separate celebrations.

Thursday night we remember the Last Supper when Christ instituted the Sacraments of Holy Orders and the Holy Eucharist. At the "end" of the liturgy there is a procession through the assembly with the Holy Eucharist to the "altar of repose" where all are invited like the apostles to "remain here and keep watch" like the disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane.

On Good Friday we remember the passion and death of our Lord. The tabernacle is empty and the church seems bare. The Passion of the Lord is always proclaimed from the Gospel of John. It is followed by the Veneration of the Cross which reminds us that through the Cross the glory of the Resurrection is achieved. All come forward to venerate the cross by kissing it, kneeling or bowing before it, or a simple touch.

Then comes the general intercessions. The entire Church throughout the world prays the same intercessions on this day. We pray for Christian unity, our Jewish brothers and sisters, non-believers, civil authorities, and those living a share in the cross.

As Good Friday is the only day of the year when mass is not celebrated, Holy Communion is received from sacred hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday night. All leave the church in silence or remain for a period of continued veneration of the Cross.

The celebration of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night tells the story of our salvation. It begins outside of the church with the lighting of the Easter fire and Paschal Candle. With lit candles the faithful process into church for the singing of the Exultet or Easter Proclamation.

An expanded Liturgy of the Word traces time through Salvation History from creation to the first Easter morning. The Sacraments of Christian initiation are celebrated with Baptisms, Confirmations, and first receptions of the Holy Eucharist taking place.

Please continue to pray for all those who will be sharing in the Sacraments of initiation this Easter.
